CMCH Ludhiana



A new mobile dental van was dedicated in August 2008. It will help to promote and provide oral rehabilitation services to people in Punjab and several neighbouring states.

The Department of Community
Dentistry has been reaching out to
people in remote areas of Northern India
for over 20 years, providing basic
treatments such as cleaning fillings and
extractions as well as providing dentures
to rural seniors. The new van, donated
by the Friends of Ludhiana UK will be
used for remote areas, and the old van
will service the population close to
Ludhiana.

Childhood Eye Disorders

The Department of Ophthalmology conducted a workshop for general practitioners in the city. Topics included paediatric cataracts, squints and retinopathy of prematurity, all of which can lead to permanent blindness. A

retinal green laser has enabled CMC to start laser therapy for premature babies suffering from retinopathy. Corneal diseases account for a large percentage of childhood blindness caused by vitamin A deficiency. CMC's Low Vision Services provides devices to help children to best use their remaining vision, helping them to act independently in normal daily activities.

Comprehensive Medical Camp

A free medical camp was organized at Christu Jyoti Hospital, Amloh where about 150 patients were examined by a team of doctors from the orthopaedic, ophthalmology and medical departments. This continues the practice of serving the poor and needy in remote areas with good quality health care.

New Medical Intensive Care Unit

In October, Rev. Dr. Malhia Joshua dedicated the new Medical Intensive Care Unit and High Dependency Unit. The old unit has been refurbished and bed capacity increased. This will ensure better care for critically ill patients.

Geriatric Care Workshop

The College of Nursing and the Department of Geriatric Care cosponsored a one-day workshop on Healthy Ageing. About 60 nurses attended. It provided the opportunity to update their knowledge about the care of the elderly and those with chronic diseases. Nutritional needs, counseling, medical care, proper assessment of needs and measures to help make their lives more fulfilling were studied.

CMC Begins Mission Workshops

CMC conducted its first Missions Workshop in the Senate Hall in the spring. About 50 delegates from various mission bodies attended the workshop, which addressed the practical problems encountered by mission hospitals in India. Many of them are facing difficulty remaining viable and relevant. Urgent steps are needed to restore and strengthen them.

At the outset, the delegates were encouraged to voice their expectations from the workshop. They unanimously agreed that they were keen to get to know, interact, partner and network with one another. Is Christian Medical mission relevant? Are the existing mission hospitals relevant? How can we become relevant? These were some of the issues discussed.

According to Dr. Vinod Shah, coordinator for Distance Education in
CMC, unless mission hospitals become
the custodians of true caring they will
become a forgotten entity. Faculty from
CMC, Christian Institute of
Management, Christian Medical
Association of India, Evangelical
Medical Fellowship of India and others
led the sessions. The mission
representatives appealed to CMC to look
into the vital need for networking the
Christian mission hospitals.

The Missions Office organized a follow up workshop in October on a variety of topics related to medical missions. About 150 delegates participated in both plenary sessions and small group discussions. A number of speakers presented different models of medical missions in the Mission Challenges sessions. Delegates were challenged to consider medical missions as a vocation.

Towards National Accreditation

The Administrative Committee has authorized CMC to work towards accreditation by the National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Health Care Providers (NABH). The accreditation will be a tool to improve standards of care throughout the institution. A Quality Council meeting, attended by 65 Departmental Quality Managers selected a Quality Steering Committee to work on this endeavor.

Anti-Retroviral Therapy Centre

A patient-friendly Anti-Retroviral Therapy Day Care Centre was opened in August. This is the result of a partnership between India's foremost cement manufacturer, ACC Ltd., CMC's Trust for Infectious Diseases and the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO). The land and technical support is supplied by CMC. ACC Ltd. is funding the infrastructure and two professional chairs and NACO will give financial support through the World Bank for extending anti-retroviral therapy.

Approximately 3,000 patients will be treated in a year. Clinical services for infectious disease, free care and support will be provided. The clinic has a consultant, medical officer, nurse, pharmacist, lab technician, medical record officer and data entry operator. This is a first time collaboration of this kind in India.

Dear Friends:

In India, most health care must be paid for privately and it is expensive. Many private practitioners take financial advantage of vulnerable patients. Some government hospitals provide free treatment, but these tend to be understaffed and do not give good quality care. There are Christian hospitals such as Ludhiana and Vellore who provide free care for some poor patients and subsidize costs for many others.

Ludhiana is using several health priorities outlined in the UN Millenium Development Goals to maximize limited resources. They will focus on reducing child mortality, improving maternal health and combating HIV/AIDS and malaria. Vellore is working towards the goal of devoting 30 per cent of their annual hospital income for free care.

I invite you to share in this caring ministry as much as you are able. Ludhiana has a Mission Fund to help the needy. Vellore has a Person to Person Program providing care for 4,222 poor patients last year.

I recently had the pleasure of discovering a band, *Aradhna*, meaning "Adoration" in Hindi. The band has recorded several albums of spiritual songs influenced by eastern and western music.
